

UNILATERAL AUTONOMY PROPOSAL

1. Unilateral autonomy constitutes a transitional phase aimed at establishing and enhancing confidence between both sides to the conflict. A successful outcome of this phase will necessarily help to define the next stage.
2. Unilateral autonomy will be implemented for a transitional period of 3 - 5 years as a confidence building measure.
3. Israel will decide on a date on which the autonomy will begin. That date will be no earlier than one and one-half years after the decision is made so as to enable adequate preparation by both sides.
4. Israel will suggest that elected local leadership run affairs in the West Bank/Gaza. Israel will hand over to that leadership all administrative responsibilities.
5. Israel will continue to be in charge of security-related issues as well as issues pertaining to the Jewish settlers in these territories.
6. All further Jewish settlements will be stopped once the decision on autonomy has been adopted by the Israeli government.
